| English proficiency             | It is important for exchange students to have strong written and verbal<br>English skills. We expect that exchange students have sufficient<br>proficiency in English. Students are unlikely to pass your or obtain the<br>necessary credits if they do not possess this level.   |
| Fall semester                   | <ul> <li><u>4 September 2023 – 2 February 2024</u></li> <li>Students may finish one or two weeks earlier, depending on the exam schedule and possible resits</li> </ul>   |
| Spring semester                 | <ul> <li><u>5 February 2024 – 5 July 2024</u></li> <li>Students may finish one or two weeks earlier, depending on the exam schedule and possible resits</li> </ul>  |
| Arrival days                    | Before the start of each semester, <u>arrival days</u> are organised for<br>exchange students. During the Arrival Day students can arrange several<br>practical matters in the same day.  |
| Introduction week               | The Erasmus Student Network Amsterdam (ESN) organises an introduction week for exchange students and several events during their mobility.  |
| Introduction meeting at faculty | Shortly before the start of the semester, the International office organises an introduction meeting at the faculty.  |
